The street that does not have to have a survey filled out is Lister Dairy, I-65 Service Road N, Ellison Ave, Rio Honda and Sailor Rd, Madrid St. The street that have to have a survey is Carroll Lane , Smith Rd and Creola Dr, Hardy Dr, Ken Moss Ct, N Bentley Rd, Skidmore St, Ward lane, Tolbert Rd, Halls Branch Rd, Jackson Rd, and Dead lake Rd,

Mr. Tim Ryals states that the cement trucks are still rolling through the city. Mayor states the owner will be at the next meeting. Mayor states that he and the Chief are discussing truck route.

Councilman K. Walker states that pot holes need to be patched.

ADDITIONAL NOTES
